## 1SEC. 2. STUDY OF NATIONAL SECURITY RISKS POSED BY2CERTAIN ROUTERS AND MODEMS.

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall conduct a 4 study of the national security risks posed by consumer 5 routers, modems, and devices that combine a modem and 6 router that are designed, developed, manufactured, or sup-7 plied by persons owned by, controlled by, or subject to the 8 influence of a covered country.

9 (b) REPORT TO CONGRESS.—Not later than 1 year 10 after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary 11 shall submit to the Committee on Energy and Commerce 12 of the House of Representatives and the Committee on 13 Commerce, Science, and Transportation of the Senate a 14 report on the results of the study conducted under sub-15 section (a).
