Dear Acting Commissioner O'Donnell:

I write today to request information in the Internal Revenue Service's (IRS) possession that will reveal any and all of Jeffrey Epstein's associates and business dealings. Over the course of many years, Jeffrey Epstein built a heinous global sex trafficking network that caused irreparable harm to countless women. Since Mr. Epstein's death in 2019, there is still much about this tragic case that is not known. The American people deserve transparency regarding the criminal web that Jeffrey Epstein and Ghislaine Maxwell established, and their business associations are critical to that understanding. I hope and expect that you will work with me in providing answers to the public. To that end, I respectfully request that you transmit to me and release to the American public the following records that are in the IRS's possession:

- 1. Any and all documents, records, or memoranda in your agency's possession that reveal the names of individuals and entities that held any type of financial relationship with Jeffrey Epstein or Ghislaine Maxwell.
- 2. Any and all documents, records, or memoranda pertaining to Jeffrey Epstein and Ghislaine Maxwell.

This critical information is long overdue. The survivors of Mr. Epstein's horrific crimes want transparency and accountability, and they—and the American people—deserve nothing less.

Thank you for your attention to this critical matter.
